The remainder of monies designated on offering envelopes are distributed by the recommendation of the Deacons at year's end. As for volunteering and donations these are the areas routinely touched.

For **15 years** beginning 2021 we have consistently and loving donated food to CUOC. In 2012 we led the

community in boosting donations of personal hygiene items and we began a monthly contribution of personal hygiene products.

We routinely support East Lee Middle School. This began in 2006. The alliance has beautifully evolved over the past **fourteen years**.

Over the years we have done major home and kitchen starter kits for HAVEN.

We are consistent with giving **One Great Hour** of Sharing offerings,

Our church wide Christmas projects are amazing – thanks to all of you! At least 20 families have been helped by our angel trees. We have experienced families crying, hugging, and squealing with delight as a majority.

Of course, we have done a variety of projects that filled a need at the time, and we will continue to do so.



R.A. Torrey was an American evangelist, pastor, educator, and writer. He once wrote, "When the devil sees a man or woman who really believes in prayer, who knows how to pray, and who really does pray, and, above all, when he sees a whole church on its face before God in praver, he trembles as much as he ever did, for he knows that his day in that church or community is at an end."

Folks, there is power in prayer. I believe that prayer transcends time and space. There is no doubt in my mind that the prayers from years ago by others (mainly my parents) are still being answered today. So why, if we have such an incredible resource, would we not use it in our lives? Again, Torrey shares from his renowned book, How to Prav:

Still God answers, "Neglect of prayer. You have not because you ask not."

"Why is it," both ministers and churches are asking, "that the church of Christ makes so little headway against unbelief and error and sin and worldliness?"

Once more we hear God answering, "Neglect of prayer. You have not because you ask not."

There is a reason why prayer is called a spiritual discipline. Committing to fervent prayer is not easy but remember, even Jesus Himself prayed often and intentionally. May all of us commit to this type of prayer and experience its truly amazing power.
