Philippians 4:13 Explained by Eric Burmahl



The Apostle Paul expresses in Philippians 4:13 that he "can do all things through Him who strengthens me." There are two aspects to consider: what does this mean, and what does this not mean? To understand what this verse means, one must look at the context. Paul explains in verse 10 that he appreciates the gift from the Philippians. Still, in verse 11, we read he had learned to be content with whatever circumstances may arise. In verse 12, Paul states that he knew how to live humbly or in prosperity. He had learned to be satisfied with being filled or being hungry, as well as having an abundance or being in need. In verse 13, the "all things" points us to the "in any and every" of verse 12. Paul can do all things in every circumstance because of his relationship with Jesus Christ. The Greek helps us to further understand "I can do all things." First, the verb "do" is better translated as "be strong, powerful, able prevailing over." Secondly, the Greek translation of the preposition (ev) as "through" can cause one to miss Paul's point. We have an improved understanding that "in" Christ, we are empowered. From the Greek, we better know that Paul's strength came from his union with the Lord Jesus Christ in faith. In the Greek, "him who strengthens me," the verb is a Present, Active Participle. (the one who strengthens). It is essential to see that the focus is the ongoing, powerful work that Christ is doing in Paul's life. What the text does not mean is that we have unlimited spiritual abilities as Christians. "All things" should not be understood as "everything." We should not go jumping off cliffs in reaction to reading this verse, taking literal meaning to the individual verse. From the context, it is clear that Paul is referring to his apostolic ministry, not just anything he wishes to do. Paul knows that he can prevail in the commission he was given because of his union with Christ, whom he remains connected to daily, the indwelling Christ.
